## BIBLIOGRAPHIES FOR SEMINARS

The following bibliographies are for the study of Reformed theology by the seminars of the Foundation for Reformed Theology, previously the Fund for the Explication and Application of Reformed Theology. *They may not be used for any other purpose without express written permission from the Foundation, and then credit must be given to the Foundation.*

The First Seminar and Options I-XXVI, XXIX, and XXXI-XXXIII are the only topics approved at this time. While other topics may be good and useful in and of themselves, only those groups which study these topics will be considered seminars of the Foundation, and only those groups will have their expenses reimbursed.

The First Seminar will be required reading for the first meeting of all new seminars. This will provide a way for our new leaders and members to meet Dr. Leith through his writings. After the first year, any of the approved “Options” may be chosen.

This is a work in progress. Some of the information is not bibliographically complete. Attempts are being made to correct that, and I would welcome any input you may have. Internet links are being added, both for electronic versions of texts and for sources from which to obtain texts. Efforts are being made to review these selections and to update some of the readings as needed. Efforts are being made to generate bibliographies on additional topics, such as Option XXVII: The Anti-Christian Movement in America, Option XXVIII: The Nature of Evil, and Option XXX: Biblical Authority and Interpretation in the Reformed Tradition.

In an appendix at the end of this document, links have been added for seminary libraries, on-line resources, and bookstores. We, of course, have no control over these sites. These links have been added for your convenience. If you encounter a problem, let us know so we can remove the link.

The content of these bibliographies, the selection and support of seminar leaders, and the approval of seminar locations fall under the purview of the Program Committee.
