

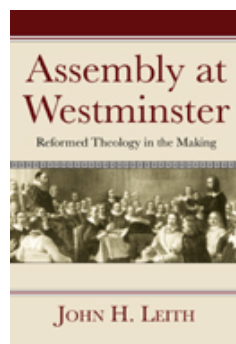
Dear Friends of the Foundation:

This study was undertaken to document the historical and human character of the Westminster Confession. Only when the historical character of the Confession is freely acknowledged can it be a guide for Christian thinking and preaching today.

It is hoped that this study will illuminate the nature of the theological enterprise by examining an important example of it. Theology is understood in this study as dialogue, that is, as the Christian community's effort to articulate its faith under the norm of the Christian revelation and in the context of a particular time and place. It is also hoped that this study will be useful to ruling elders and to church members who affirm the Confession as their authoritative statement of faith. Without a historical understanding of the Confession this is a difficult affirmation, but with an awareness of the historical character of the Confession and of the theological enterprise generally, this can be a meaningful act of faith and churchmanship.
